



Whirld Sports would like to congratulate you on your purchase of the SCEPTER Disc Golf Caddie™. The SCEPTER has several primary functions that will SAVE YOUR TIME, YOUR BACK, AND YOUR DISCS.

First and foremost, the SCEPTER is designed to pick-up and place golf discs and minis. In this capacity, the SCEPTER can be generally thought of as a “**shagger.**” When multiple discs are thrown while warming up or practicing, the SCEPTER can be used to speed the recovery and retrieval of these discs. You will no longer be required to do all that bending and stooping.



In the “shagging” mode the SCEPTER is set at a reasonably short length and is used much like a trash collector’s spike. It is best if it is grasped at the top (as shown) with just two or three fingers.

A quick ‘pecking’ type motion is all that’s needed. Simply “peck” the suction cup against a flat surface on the disc and the capture is made.



As the SCEPTER is lifted, the bellows will meet your palm so that all you have to do is squeeze it when you’re ready to release the disc.

This patented feature allows you to pick up discs and release them with just one hand!

To set the length of the SCEPTER, slightly loosen the largest diameter collar and extend the telescopic tubing. Once it is at the correct length, firmly tighten the collar to lock the position. If the SCEPTER shortens while shagging, the collar just needs to be tightened more.

The second primary function of the SCEPTER Disc Golf Caddie™ is that of a disc “**retriever.**” When a disc is thrown into a location with difficult access (IE: a water hazard, over a fence, on a roof, under a car, or in a tree), the SCEPTER Disc Golf Caddie™ is there for the rescue. Using one or more of the locking collars simply extend the SCEPTER to the length you need (up to 2 meters) and retrieve your disc. In similar manner as when shagging, simply press the suction cup down on the flat portion of the disc and you have it. The suction cup can pivot 90° so you’ll have no problem retrieving from under fences, on roofs, etc.

Under water usage:

The SCEPTER **will** work under water. Simply press down against the disc and the suction cup will engage. It is important that you then **tilt the disc** to minimize water resistance, as you, “fly” it up and out of the water.

When using the SCEPTER in water, simply be aware that water intake has the potential to clog the bellows and degrade normal operation. This can be prevented by 1) **never squeezing the bellows while the suction cup is in water**, and 2) by making sure to expel water that may enter the tubing. This is best performed by rapidly squeezing the bellows while shaking the retracted SCEPTER in a downward motion.

Also keep in mind that if the water hazard has a muddy or silty bottom and pushing down, with the suction cup, would plunge the disc into the mud, it may be best to simply use the SCEPTER to drag the disc towards the shore.

A third function that the SCEPTER serves is that of a **measuring stick**. According to Rule 803.08b in the *Official Rules of Disc Golf*, “If a disc has come to rest above two meters, as measured from the lowest point of the disc to the playing surface directly below it, the player shall be assessed one penalty throw.” When extended to its full length, the SCEPTER measures 2 meters, so that it can be used to help determine this ruling.

One of the built-in features of the SCEPTER is that it is SELF RETRACTING, which means that after you’ve retrieved a disc, all you have to do is loosen the locking collars and the SCEPTER will quickly retract to its normal length.

Though it works great on virtually any flying disc and in most circumstances, please understand that leaves, excessive dirt, raised graphics, or ridges may impede the SCEPTER’s ability to maintain suction.

The SCEPTER has a built-in retracting mechanism. When extended to its longest configuration, there is significant tension in the retractor. Please be careful when loosening the Locking Collars and retracting the SCEPTER.

For best results *always store the SCEPTER in the fully retracted configuration*. Place the cup either on a flat surface or in the air.

Because of the soft plastic suction cup, the performance of the Scepter is degraded at temperatures below 40° F. Whirl Sports is aware of this issue and is working towards a solution.

The SCEPTER was designed solely for the purpose of picking up and placing flying discs. It is NOT intended to be used as a walking stick and will not support the weight of a person.

WARRANTY

The SCEPTER carries a 6 month, limited warranty. Due to the recent introduction of the product, this warranty may be lengthened without notice to the consumer.
